Talk on alternative study paths after S6 ; c. Consultation sessions offered by HKU, CUHK, etc at our school campus (S3 students are encouraged to attend); d. “University Preparation Workshop” by ARCH-Community Outreach; e. Visits to specific faculties/departments of various tertiary institutions/workplaces. 2. To provide Academic Advising Sessions, JUPAS Talk and Experience Sharing Session, DSE Talk on Results Release, Interview Workshop, etc. for S6 students 3. Total CLP grant available in academic year 2015-2016 = \$58,662.10 (brought forward) +\$541,560 = \$600,222.10

Total expenses = \$542,820 + \$8,700 + \$14,285 + \$4,000 = \$569,805

which gives a surplus of \$600,222.10 – \$569,805 = \$30,417.10
